#### **Drone Flight**

On Monday this week, Joe Zebrowski and his NMHU team completed a drone flight over the CNP. Joe uses these flights for training students and the CNP provides excellent terrain for data collection. In addition, the flights provide a rich dataset for CNP management.

#### Vegetation Monitoring

Last Friday volunteers helped to complete vegetation transects in Field IB. These transects are an important part of the monitoring process to evaluate the effectiveness of management decisions. Thank you to Ruth, Terry, and Jacob for leading this effort!

## Update of May 10:

Good evening, friends and partners of Candelaria Nature Preserve!

I hope everyone had a nice week. I want to share this week's update on CNP with you, below:

#### Irrigation

CNP received its third preserve-wide irrigation water of the season this week. New seedlings in Field 4A are being given special irrigation attention because they are still in a vulnerable stage of their development. Fields 2A and 3A received additional water last week to try and flush weed seeds out of the soil. Rio Grande Return will be doing another shallow till in 2A and 3A to prepare the soil for seeding, which is intended to happen before receiving the next irrigation notices.

#### **Drone Flights**

New Mexico Highlands University will be doing a drone flight to collect multispectral data at CNP next week - this provides CNP with useful data for management purposes and also serves as a valuable training exercise for NMHU students and staff.

#### Family Nature Club

This month's <u>Family Nature Club</u> event was held at CNP this past weekend, and the theme was Bosque Critters.

CABQ Open Space Division has confirmed an active American Kestrel nest box, the presence of Swainson's Hawks that are actively building nests on-site, and a Cooper's Hawk that has been seen nesting on the south tract of CNP.
